1. Welcome

Members welcomed and meeting declared open. The Panel approved the Minutes from Meeting 3 and Meeting 4.

As requested, members had updated the OCSE conflicts and interests declaration; which were discussed. Due to his current work relating to South32, Professor Hebblewhite indicated he would recuse himself from the Item 5 presentation. Further, as the focus of the Panel was transitioning from higher level identification and discussion of issues to more detailed and operational matters, consideration was given to his ongoing role. The Panel discussed the challenges of separating high level discussion from more detailed discussion relating to company information that Professor Hebblewhite may have access to. It was agreed that the Secretariat would discuss the implications with the Department of Planning and Environment. Consistent with this decision, Professor Hebblewhite elected to leave the meeting after Item 2a.

5. Presentation from South32

South32 had requested a meeting with the Panel to present additional information about their groundwater model that had progressed since their initial presentation to the Panel on 5 March. Mr Economidis presented on the economic aspects of the Dendrobium mining operation and the company's future plans. Mr Economidis also inquired about the status of approval of the Subsidence Management Plan lodged for Longwall 16. The Chair noted that the role of the Panel is to provide expert technical advice and suggested Mr Economidis discuss the status of the application with the Department of Planning and Environment.
