- the impacts of coal seam gas activities on human health and the environment
- issues pertaining to compliance and monitoring
- lack of scientific data relating to fugitive emissions, as well as impacts on human health, water catchments, and the environment
- how coal seam gas in NSW compares with its operation in other states (such as Queensland) or internationally (such as the USA)
- ask the Chief Scientist to visit coal seam gas operations (such as drilling and fracking) in areas where the industry is most active (for example Camden, Gloucester, the Pilliga or Casino)
- request that the Chief Scientist seek out or commission truly independent sources of information in order to develop fact sheets so that she doesn't rely on industry information
