I, with other family members, farm land in the Liverpool Plains Shire. I and my family members are members of the Caroona Coal Action Group.

I support of the submission you have received from Mrs Rosemary Nankivell CSG Chairman of the Caroona Coal Action Group.

I am concerned about the impact CSG will have on the Liverpool Plains and those you live and farm there. Specifically, some of my concerns are:

- the general pollution of the environment and the effect this will have on the health of humans and flora and fauna
- the depletion and contamination of water resources
- subsidence
- that any perceived advantage in allowing CSG mining would be nothing compared to the loss to Australia as a whole if the agricultural pursuits of the Liverpool Plains are interfered with.

Areas like the Liverpool Plains should not be exposed to an industry that presents specific risks proven to be real in the USA, for example. We should not allow to Australia become dependent on imported food and the livelihood of thousands taken away . There is a strong likelihood that this could well be the result if CSG and other mining is allowed on Australian prime agricultural land.
